MAINTAINING YOUR FURNITURE INTERIORS:

The interiors are designed to maximise comfort while complementing the style of your sofa.

- ▶ Interiors typically lose 10% of their density within the first three months, increasing to 20–30% over time. To extend their lifespan, rotate cushions and change seating positions regularly, where possible.
- For fixed-seat models, avoid "side sitting" (sitting or lying on cushion edges), as this can cause excessive sagging.

REGULAR AND EASY-CARE MAINTENANCE

- Avoid dragging furniture across the floor. For heavier items like sofas and armchairs, get assistance to lift them when moving between spaces to protect your floors and avoid injuries.
- Do not sit or perch on the arms or back of your furniture, as this can distort the frame.
- Certain cosmetics, hair products, and medications can stain or damage fabric.
 Wash your hands after use and consider layering throws over furniture to prevent transfer.
- Protect furniture from direct sunlight to prevent fading. Prolonged exposure to strong LED lights can also fade fabric.
- Non-colourfast clothing like denim can stain light-coloured fabrics if frequently in contact.
- For reclining sofas, ensure the footrest is fully retracted before standing up to prevent strain or damage.
- Due to the opulent nature of velvet, on occasion, pile crush may occur from packing, but this is a simple remedy with steam, which will immediately remedy the matter.



CLEANING

- Vacuum or gently brush your sofa weekly to minimise dust and reduce the risk of pilling.
- If cushions are removable, rotate them weekly to ensure even wear on foam and fabric.
- Plump back cushions regularly to maintain their shape. The loose fibre filling inside needs air to stay evenly distributed.
- Avoid using spray polishes or solvent cleaners, as they can damage the fabric and surrounding materials.
- In case of spills, blot excess liquid with a clean white cloth immediately. Do not rub or use detergents.
